• Our school is in the village of Draperstown in the parish of Ballinascreen at the foothills of the picturesque Sperrin Mountains. We have been a Green Flag school since 2010 and have worked closely with local community groups and schools on a range of eco projects. We are a member of the award-winning Screen Eco Schools. The school has developed the school grounds to promote outdoor learning and ecology. An extensive school garden and biodiversity area promote sustainability and environmental education. Eco Schools is embedded in the curriculum at St Mary's. Blooming Ballinascreen was a very ambitious Screen Eco Schools project that we were involved in. The whole community embarked on daffodil planting across the parish! We are currently involved in an exciting community project called Balglen. In this project our parish is twinned with the Glenties in County Donegal.

Topic Actions:

Major Topic: Litter

Established school 'Litter Patrol' at breaks and lunch times.

Class litter picks in biodiversity area/pitches, Draperstown Village and in Plantin Park.

Community litter picks: Joint litter picks with St. Colm's High and community litter picks.

Draperstown in Bloom - Community initiative with St. Colm's to plant areas with flowers. It is funded by the council. Children are informed of the issues of littering. They are encouraged to come up with solutions.

Minor Topic: Healthy Living

My Marathon/Mini Miles - whole school (and school community) running/walking initiative. During month of October.

Daily Mile - encouraged classes to get outside for a walk/jog.

Sustrans Active Travel Programme -Increased the number of children who regularly walk or cycle to school.

Eco-Committee presentation to classes on healthy lifestyles. Healthy living lessons delivered in all classes. Healthy Living theme included on all teaching planners.



Minor Topic: Outdoor Learning

Established a gardening team to maintain the school garden. Gave all classes opportunities to plant and harvest in the school garden.

Provided resources and lesson ideas to support classes with outdoor learning.

Disseminated Key Stage appropriate resources to encourage outdoor learning. Outdoor learning was included on teaching planners.

Developed our outdoor spaces to facilitate lessons and learning opportunities.

Sharing Good Practice Actions:

We have a long well-established relationship with St Colm's High. We have supported each other in our green flag applications and ambassador actions. We also supported Gaelscoil na Speiríní with their Eco Schools journey. We have also provided advice and guidance for St Eoghan's PS for their initial Green Flag application. The award-winning Screen Eco Schools promotes the sharing of good practice across all the local schools. First Minister, Michelle O'Neill visited the school to observe and participate in our My Marathon initiative. The First Minister learned how the initiative promotes health and wellbeing.
